

NET ZERO: PREPARING SOUTH AUSTRALIA FOR THE TRANSITION

The Hon. David Speirs MP LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION AND MEMBER FOR BLACK



David Speirs was elected as the Leader of the Opposition in South Australia after the 2022 election.

At the same election, his community voted to return him to serve as Member for Black for another term.

David was South Australia's Minister for Environment and Water and the Marshall Liberal Government's Cabinet Secretary between March 2018 and March 2022. He became the state's youngest minister and one of the youngest in South Australia's history.

He has been a Member of Parliament since his election at the age of 29 in 2014. First serving as Member for Bright, and then as Member for Black following the 2018 election. His seat is located in Adelaide's southern suburbs covering suburbs such as Hallett Cove, Sheidow Park and Marino.

Prior to David's election to parliament he served as a local councillor on Marion Council between 2010 and 2014, also serving in the role of Deputy Mayor for 2011-2013.

Richard Day director strategy, policy and communications, growth and low carbon division, office of hydrogen power sa



Richard Day joined the South Australian Government in 2001 and since that time has worked across the energy, climate change and industry portfolios.

Since 2016 his mission has been to capture the economic growth and decarbonisation opportunities associated with South Australia's clean energy transformation, in particular renewables, energy storage, hydrogen and electric vehicles.

In March 2023 Richard joined the Office of Hydrogen Power South Australia in the role of Director Industry Development.

As a passionate advocate for migration reform and the strategic implications migration has on economic and industry growth, Mark consults to individual applicants, families, business, industry, regions and government on pathways to achieve their goals through the Australian migration program. This has included facilitating industry round table discussions between business / industry associations / regional development / state government, on multiple occasions, including during the development of the South Australian (SA) Designated Area Migration Agreement (DAMA). He has championed independent research on the relationship between economic growth and immigration, using results to address state and federal governments, politicians, and departments, about a range of migration issues.




